

Mowbray School Pupil Premium academic year 2020/21

This document explains how the school has planned to use its allocation of funding which is called the pupil premium for the academic year 2020/2021. The school receives additional funding for those pupils who are in receipt of free school meals; who are looked after or in the care of the Local Authority; who have a parent in the Armed Forces and children who have been adopted or in the care of grandparents. In total out of our school population of 258, we have 109 pupils for whom we receive the pupil premium. However please note that this number varies during the year as children join or leave the school, as will therefore our financial allocation.

Our pupil premium allocation for 2020/21 is £106,683.00 for the pupil premium, this includes £11,819 year 7 catch up funding.

Additional pupil support provided by staff

Mowbray School employs two parent liaison officers to work specifically with families, to assist school in addressing issues relating to pupil's well-being and their education, the focus of this work is with families whose child the school receives the pupil premium. This also includes working with families who are in the Armed Forces and liaising with different departments within the Military.
