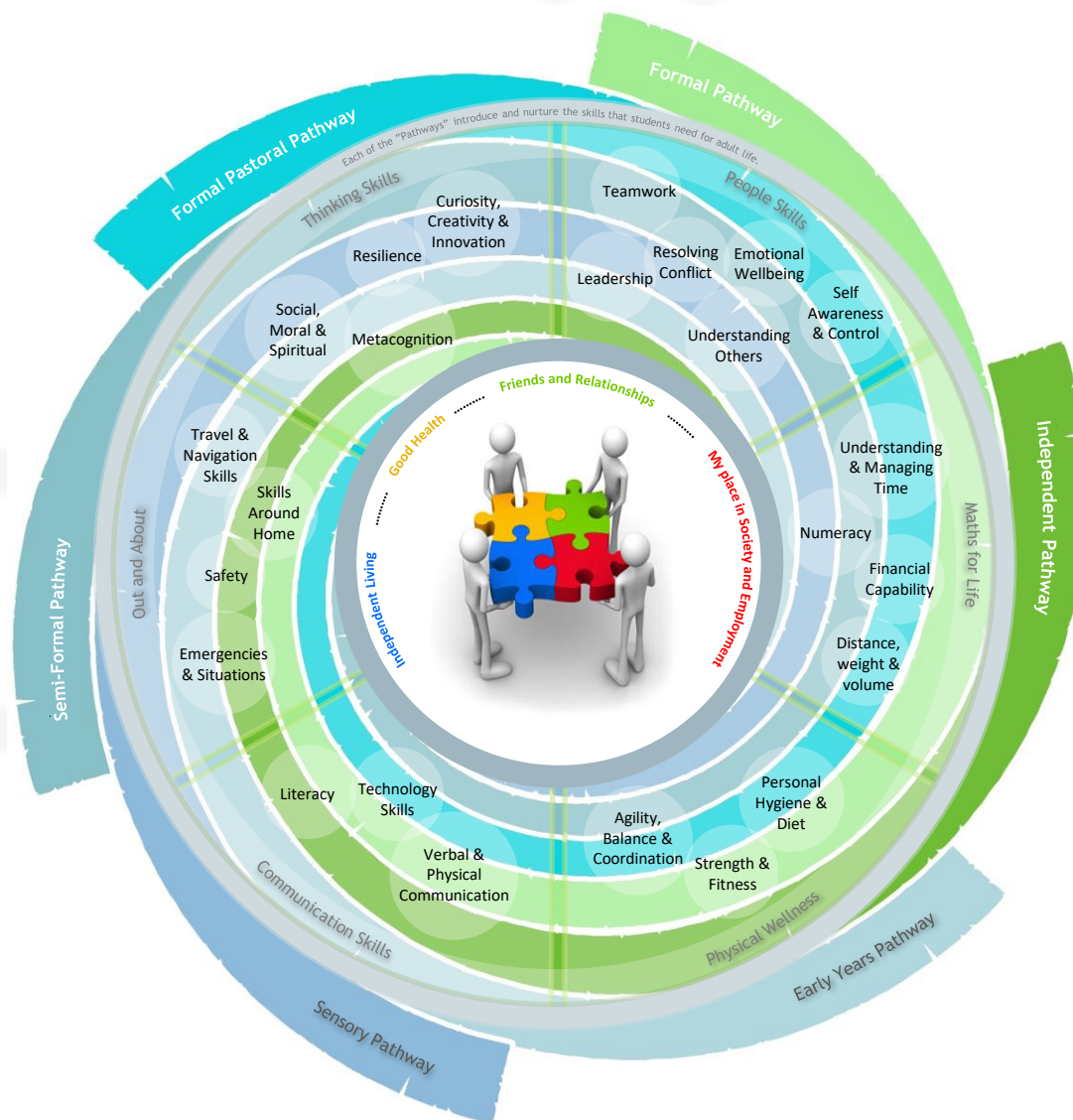

An apprenticeship is a real job where students learn, gain experience and get paid. They're an employee with a contract of employment and holiday leave.

Apprenticeships start at Level 2, Students do not need to have completed English and Maths courses at Level 2, but they must be working at or near that level

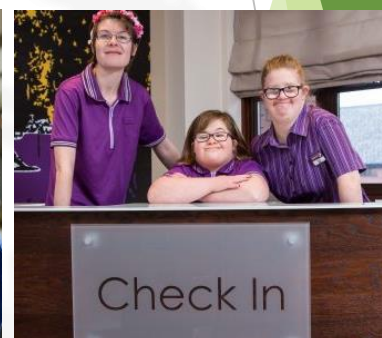


Post 16 Choices Supported Internships

A **Supported Internship** is a type of study programme specifically aimed at young people aged 16 to 24 who have a statement of special educational needs or an EHC plan, who want to move into employment and need extra support to do so.

Supported internships are structured study programmes based primarily at an employer. They are intended to enable young people with learning difficulties and/or disabilities to achieve sustainable, paid employment by equipping them with the skills they need for work through learning in the workplace.

Supported Internships are co-ordinated by a Post 16 School or College.

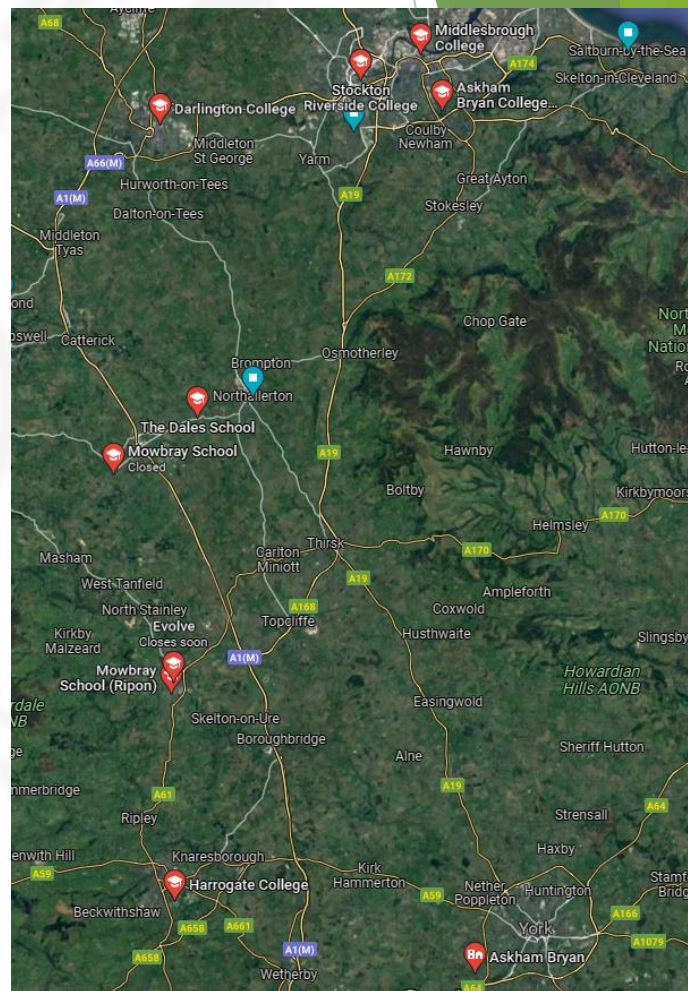

Going to College? Which one?

Once the aspirations of the young person have been identified, the next stage of their career (Post 16 phase), should build on the learning taken place at Mowbray School and further develop their preparation for adulthood.

Many factors will need to be considered when identifying the best placement for the next educational step in a young persons career. These include: Location, Type and level of courses offered, Number of days provision available, Transport arrangements and so on.

The following colleges are an example of where our past students have gone on to study. It is not a definitive list, and there may be other venues that meet the needs of a learner that have not been used as an example here.

Darlington College - Next Steps



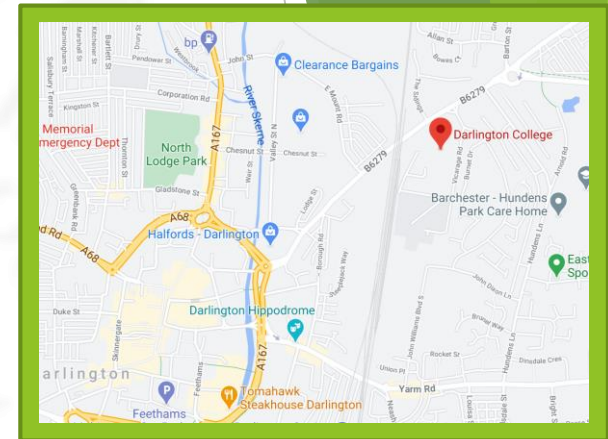
Next Steps provides a supported learning environment for young people working towards post-16 qualifications and employment.

Next Steps provides courses for young people at Entry Levels 1-3 and up to Level 1 for the work based programmes. You can make progress through the Levels before moving on to other courses or leaving college to do other things, including moving on to employment.

No formal qualifications are required to get onto the Next Steps but English and maths skills are assessed to make sure the course will be at the right level for you.

Evolve College (Ripon)



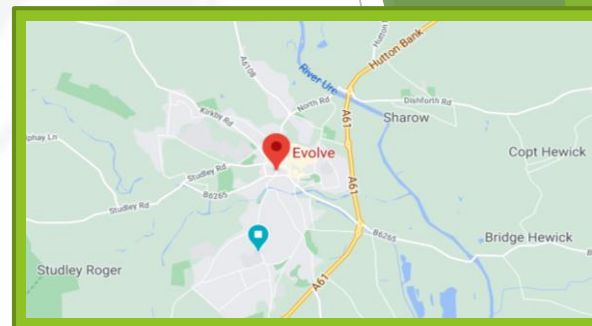
Evolve is a small college in the centre of Ripon. We provide an alternative to a large campus for full-time students in a supportive, friendly and inclusive environment.

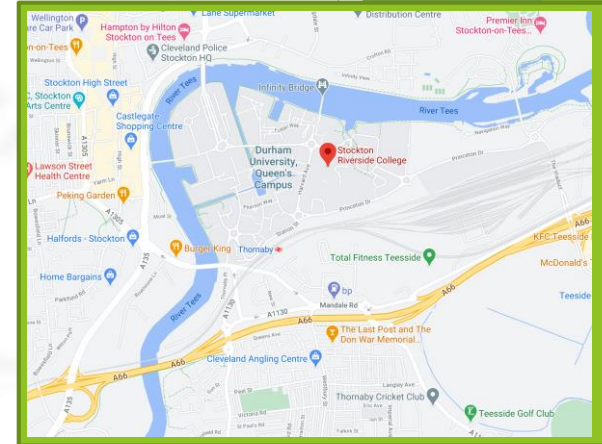
Stockton Riverside College

Askham Bryan College

Askham Bryan College Middlesbrough Centre (STEWART PARK)

Following a successful Heritage Lottery Fund grant, the Grade II listed Central Lodge located at Stewart Park was transformed into a state of the art Animal Management and Land-based teaching facility in September 2017.

The campus offers a full range of courses that can either be full time, part time or Apprenticeships, and from Entry Level to Level 3 in the following programmes of study:

- Animal Management
- Equine
- Land and Plant
- Countryside and Horticulture

Additional to the main campus building is the Stewart Park Visitors' Centre and reception as well as Henry's Café, walled and kitchen gardens, all open to the public throughout the year. In the wider park the college looks after the animal enclosures housing avians, farm and other large animals including fallow deer, llamas and goats.

Post 16 Choices The Dales School

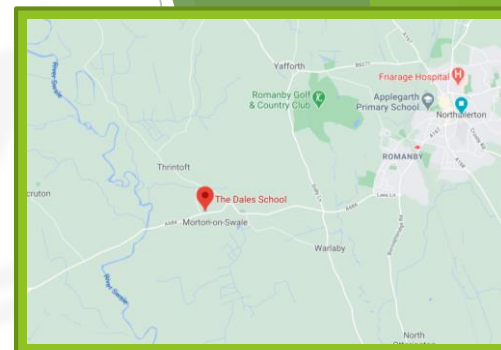


The Dales sixth form prepares young people for adulthood; the curriculum model reflects the areas of learning that support this important transitional process.

The areas of focus are based upon:
a vocational programme; accreditation; transitions and careers advice;
independence and life skills; physical; functional skills; and cultural/creative.
Students have MAPP [Mapping and Assessing Personal Progress] individual learning intentions which underpin all their learning areas.

We follow a theme each term that we build our activities upon and which support students' interests and develop leisure skills to take forward into adulthood.

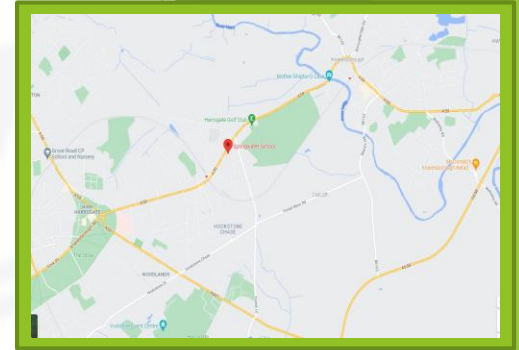


Post 16 Choices Springwater School

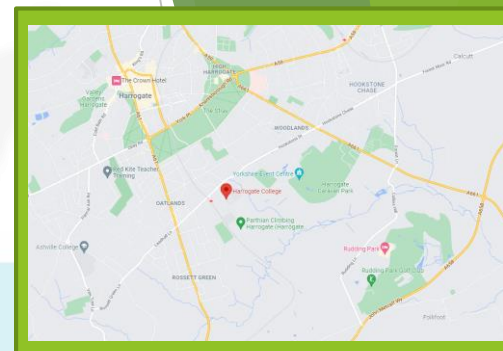
